## **SUBJECT IN POSSESSION OF 15 CHILD PORN VIDEOS IS ARRESTED**

On May 1, 2024, Miami Police's Special Victims Unit's Internet Crimes Against Children Detail arrested 39-year-old Junior Del Villar Hernandez and charged him with 15 counts of Sexual Performance By A Child/Possession.

The investigation began September of 2022, pursuant to the upload of approximately fifteen videos of child sexual abuse material. Since then, Miami Police Detectives worked tirelessly to build the case, identify the offender, and locate him. Due to the gravity of the crime, detectives immediately executed a search warrant. Detectives uncovered extremely disturbing videos that showed sexual acts on minors as young as two-years-old.

The detectives chased many misleading leads over the past 18 months. Through investigative techniques the detectives were able to strategically devise a plan to identify 39-year-old Junior Del Villar Hernandez as the person who downloaded these 15 videos. He was also messaging underage females through social media.

The Miami Police Department takes any crime against infants/children seriously and will work tirelessly to identify and bring to justice those who engage in such acts against the innocent and helpless children. Therefore, if you believe you were a victim targeted by Hernandez, we urge you to come forward.
