## **OFFICER-INVOLVED SHOOTING**

Today, Thursday, October 9, 2025, at approximately 6:14 a.m., Miami Police officers responded to a call in the area of NW 14<sup>th</sup> Avenue and NW 26<sup>th</sup> Street of an abandoned vehicle which was in the process of being towed. Officers checked the scene and cleared it without incident.

Approximately an hour later, at 7:47 a.m., officers were dispatched back to the same location for a ShotSpotter alert of multiple gunshots fired in the area.

Upon arrival, officers located a vehicle riddled with bullet holes and began their investigation. They quickly learned that the gunfire was connected to a domestic-related dispute involving the suspect and a relative, who had already fled the scene.

At 7:55 a.m., while officers were continuing their investigation, the suspect—who had barricaded himself inside a nearby residence—opened fire on officers, striking two of them.

The injured officers were immediately transported by fellow officers in police vehicles to Jackson Memorial Hospital's Ryder Trauma Center, where they are currently receiving medical treatment.

Shortly afterward, as tactical units arrived and began to further investigate, the barricaded suspect exited the residence and fired at officers before retreating inside. Officers returned fire.

The suspect was pronounced deceased inside the residence. He has been identified as 27-year-old Mason Triana (D.O.B. 11/4/1997).

The investigation remains ongoing.

In accordance with standard protocol for officer-involved shootings, the Florida Department of Law Enforcement (FDLE) has assumed the lead in this investigation.
