The driver (victim) of the 2006 red Nissan has passed. She has been identified as Mayra Sanchez 05/08/1958.

Today, January 24, 2022 at approximately 12 noon., City of Miami Police officers responded to a hit-and-run crash at the intersection of N.W. 11th Avenue and N.W. 3rd Street.

According to the on-scene preliminary investigation, the driver of a white Range Rover was traveling southbound on N.W. 11th Avenue when it failed to yield at a stop-sign at the intersection, ultimately colliding into a red sedan that was traveling eastbound on N.W. 3rd Street. As a result of the impact, five unoccupied vehicles that were parked on the side of the road were struck.

Approximately three young males, anywhere between 17-20 years of age exited the white Range Rover and fled on foot.

Both the driver and passenger of the red sedan were adult females and have since been transported by Miami Fire Rescue to Jackson Memorial Hospital Ryder Trauma Center in serious condition.

Detectives are still investigating the case and are working on identifying the driver of the White Range Rover and the accomplices who fled the scene of the crash.
